The Cabins

From the minute guests step onboard Spirit of Adventure and are greeted by the ship's crew lined-up to welcome them, everything is geared towards a luxurious, boutique time at sea.

Life in the beautifully designed cabins is a key part of this. Across the ship as a whole, each guest has the equivalent of a double decker bus of space and the cabins are no exception. Clever design touches and a commitment to challenge the traditional aspects of cabin design make for a spacious, relaxing experience.

554 CABINS, PLENTY OF CHOICE

In total, Spirit of Adventure has 554 cabins, every one of which has its own private balcony. There are four Forward Suites, 36 Midship suites and eight Aft suites. Additionally, there are 386 Standard Balcony cabins and 60 Deluxe cabins.

Standard cabins are 215 square feet and feature four different designs and colour palettes, while Deluxe cabins offer 350 square feet of accommodation and a walk-in wardrobe.

Unlike many cruise ships, those travelling on their own aren't penalised onboard Spirit of Adventure, with 109 Single cabins specially designed – and priced – accordingly. Single cabins are available in a variety of grades, with a floor plan of 161 square feet for a standard cabin up to 311 feet for a Suite.

Those travelling solo will find the room appointed specifically for them, rather than with a default two-person set-up. Cabins are mixed across each deck, rather than one type all being together, creating more opportunities for new friendships to develop.

Every cabin offers Wi-Fi, a flat-screen TV with free on demand movies, 24-hour room service, tea and coffee-making facilities, a writing desk and seating, a fridge, mineral water and fruit basket, binoculars, a private bathroom and luxury toiletries. All guests are welcome to choose from twin beds or a double, and each cabin receives a nightly turndown service while guests are at dinner.

LUXURIOUS, BESPOKE-DESIGNED SUITES

For those looking for the ultimate in luxury at sea, Spirit of Adventure offers a choice of Forward, Mid-ships and Aft Suites.

All Suites onboard come with a butler service, in-cabin dining options, a morning wake-up tray (on request), pre-dinner canapés, a large seating area with a sofa and dining table, walk-in wardrobe, enhanced bathroom with twin sinks, a shower and bath.

The four Forward Suites include the Sir Roger De Haan, named after Saga's founder, as well as The Pearl Suite, Sapphire Suite and Patrick O'Sullivan Suite. These range between 765 to 855 square feet. Each has been painstakingly and individually designed from the plush green velvet of the Roger De Haan Suite to the Eastern Influenced Patrick O'Sullivan Suite.

The highest-grade accommodation onboard, these suites offer a series of living spaces to relax and dine in, a separate bedroom, luxury bathroom with a whirlpool bath, large private balcony, cabin extras such as daily newspapers, a guest bathroom, in-cabin dining for entertaining and a wine cooler. The guests' preferred choice of wine is also pre-stocked to ensure their time onboard is as memorable as possible.

Meanwhile, Mid and Aft Suites range from 462 to 540 square feet of accommodation. Like the Forward Suites they offer more personal space with a living area, and a larger balcony. The Aft Suites also have a prime location at the back of the ship with incredible, uninterrupted views out to sea.

MORE BATHROOM SPACE

Cabin bathrooms have been too small for too long on cruise ships. Often squeezed into the cabin they can be impractical for even basic things like using a towel or blowdrying your hair.

Frustrated with this longstanding trait, Saga asked the designers of Spirit of Adventure to think again and look at how to increase the space in every cabin bathroom.

The answer was to take a metre of space that was often poorly used in the bedroom and give it to the bathroom instead. It may only be one metre, but the difference makes the bathrooms far more practical.

This redesign presented a particular challenge for the larger bathrooms contained in Spirit of Adventure's Suites. The whole design of the bathroom needed reorientating and the pipework running through the cabin also had to be moved. As a result though, bathrooms are bigger and the designers could include handy new surface areas.
