Most importantly, having sufficient opportunities for play is a key indicator of our happiness: play is pleasure – it contributes to quality of life and sense of well-being.

Some ways to play

BAKE OFF



MAKE A QUIZ



People can donate to get involved in a creative activity, such as:

- bake off
- painting
- pottery
- drawing
- anything else that suits you



You're the guiz master. Put together 20 questions and invite your friends and family to take part over video call by making a donation to play.



FITNESS CHALLENGE

Pick an exercise to do every day for a month - anything from jumping jacks to press ups - and see if your family and friends will kindly sponsor you.



SCAVENGER HUNT

Host your own scavenger hunt inviting friends and family to hunt down a list of items. Ask for a donation to take part.



RUN A CLASS

Teach your friends or colleagues something new, like yoga, a language or cooking class. Ask for a donation in return.

HOST A GIG


If you have a musical talent host your own gig, it could be online or in the office. Invite friends and family to join by making a donation.

GAMING MARATHON

Roll up your sleeves and get together with friends for a crafternoon. Individuals can donate to get involved, whether it's tie dying, knitting, embroidery or your very own creative pursuit.



Love gaming? Take on a sponsored gaming marathon to raise vital funds.

This could be a 6, 12 or 24 hour challenge. You could even get together a team and try a tag team marathon.



RUN A BOOK CLUB

Set up a book club and invite friends, family and colleagues to exchange your favourite books. Donate the money you would've spent on buying the books to the Lord Mayor's charity appeal.



RUN YOUR OWN OLYMPICS



Decide which sports you will include in your Olympics, and which ones you are going to add in yourselves. People can donate to get involved or just spectate.



WACKIEST OUTFIT

People could be encouraged to dress in the most playful and wacky outfit, hair and make-up possible, and to bring a small donation. Wackiest outfit wins!

LOL

Laughter improves blood-flow and improves heart health. Complete a series of silly challenges throughout the day and donate along the way.



HAVE A DEVICE FREE DAY

Could you go off-grid for the day? Have your community sponsor you to go a day without devices. If you can't Google something, how will you find out information? Navigate your way through the day, using your imaginations.

NATURE WALK

Nature-based play is great for mental health. Prepare to get mucky. Wear your wellies and perhaps where something old, and challenge yourself to get as mucky as possible!



USE YOUR SENSES

Hide different sensory objects that people can guess by taste or touch. Donate to have a guess, and see who reigns supreme.

- A lesson pack which focusses on the local area, meeting the Geography curriculum.
- A youth voice framework which can be used by school councils or similar groups.

Schools who complete the lesson pack will be supported to plan positive and playful changes for their local area, and tips and tricks on how to make them happen!

Why play? Children have a right to play by law. Article 31 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) creates a specific right for all children to have rest and leisure. This includes play and recreational activities appropriate to their age, and cultural and arts-based experiences.
