Visitors can learn about the science behind such sports as rowing, sailing, running and even wheelchair basketball. They will find out about how muscles work, the winning skill of concentration and how to bend a shot like Beckham. You don't have to be a super-athlete to take part. This permanent learning zone is for every one, children and adults. Siemens has sponsored a 'Rowing Race Simulator' which allows two people to compete on rowing machines. Progress of the race can be viewed on a virtual lake as participant's race towards the finishing line
