# Spire Alexandra Hospital enhances all MR procedures with upgraded Avanto<sup>fit</sup> system

The Avanto<sup>fit</sup>'s inclusion of 'Dot' (Day optimising throughput) imaging technology allows the clinical users to personalise procedures according to patient needs, build in step-by-step user guidance, and automate MR examinations. This is further supported by 'Tim 4G' (Total imaging matrix), integrated coil technology. With its new RF architecture, Tim locates all transmit and receive components at the magnet, resulting in excellent image quality, a high signal-to-noise ratio and rapid acquisition times.
