# ACADEMY OF ST MARTIN IN THE FIELDS SIGNS SIEMENS AS MAJOR SPONSOR

The Academy of St Martin in the Fields announced today that it has signed up the engineering powerhouse, **Siemens**, as its Principal Sponsor. In a significant development for the internationally renowned chamber orchestra, and in spite of the recession, Siemens has committed to a three-year partnership that starts today, 7 September, with the orchestra's opening concert of the 2010/11 season.
