Siemens UK appoints rail industry leader to top job at Rail Systems

Vernon Barker will be joining Siemens UK's Rail Systems business as Managing Director in early 2017. He will succeed Steve Scrimshaw who is moving into the role of Managing Director for the Power & Gas and Power Service Divisions at Siemens UK.

Vernon Barker has a proven track record in railway management with a strong focus on safety and customer service. After over 15 years in senior managerial roles within First Group's rail businesses, including Managing Director of UK Rail, Barker has been running his own consultancy for the past year providing high level strategic counsel to the rail industry. Siemens currently has some 380 trains in passenger service in the UK and this figure is set to more than double by 2018 through projects such as the Class 707 and the 115 new Desiro City units currently being delivered on the Thameslink line.

Vernon Barker said:

"I am relishing the opportunity to lead one of the UK's key rail organisations. Siemens' Rail Systems business not only has a great reputation for the delivery and long-term maintenance of high quality trains, but also a firm commitment to furthering the industry in the UK by developing the rail supplier base and investing in the skills needed for the future.

"It is an exciting and challenging time for our industry as we look ahead to major infrastructure projects such as High Speed Two whilst addressing current issues around

capacity, connectivity and digitalisation. I am looking forward to bringing my experience from previous roles to Siemens and maintaining the momentum that has been achieved by Steve Scrimshaw and the entire Rail Systems team."

Scrimshaw has strongly contributed to the growth and success of Rail Systems in the UK over the past nine years, as well as delivering the company's commitment to developing skills across the sector through investment in projects such as the National Training Academy for Rail (NTAR) in Northampton.

"We are delighted to have secured a rail leader of Vernon's calibre at such an important time for Rail Systems. He has a proven track record of success in the sector and will bring invaluable experience and insight into the role.
