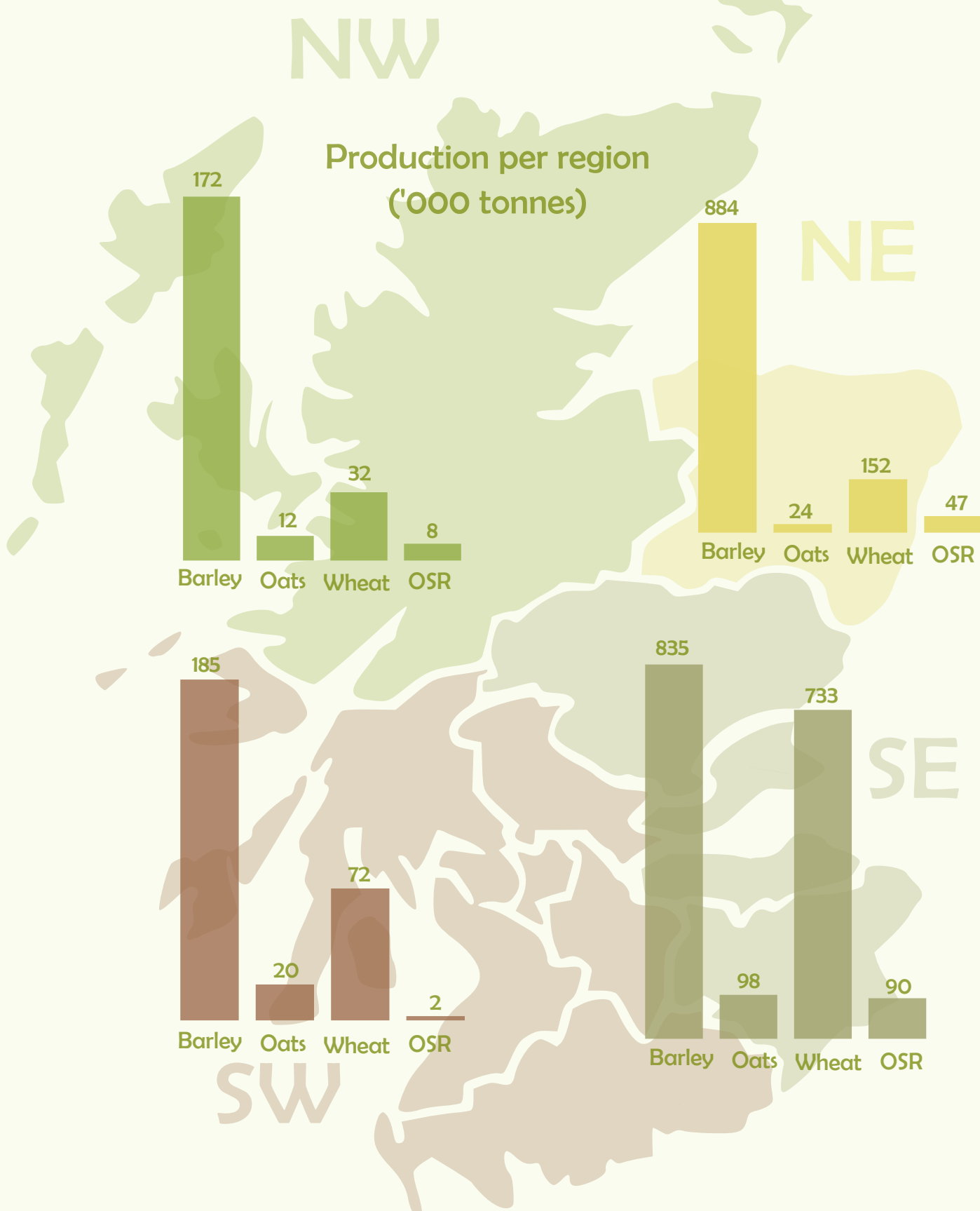
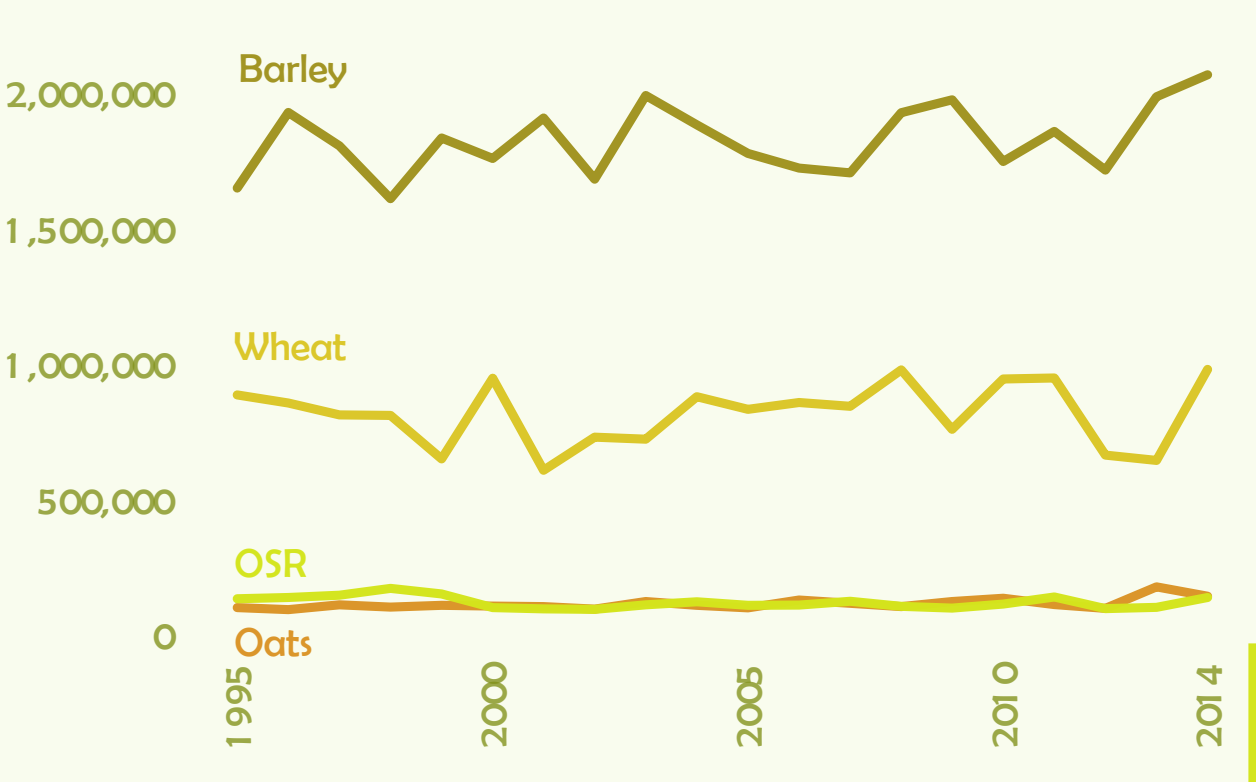


# Scottish Cereal and Oilseed Rape Harvest 2014



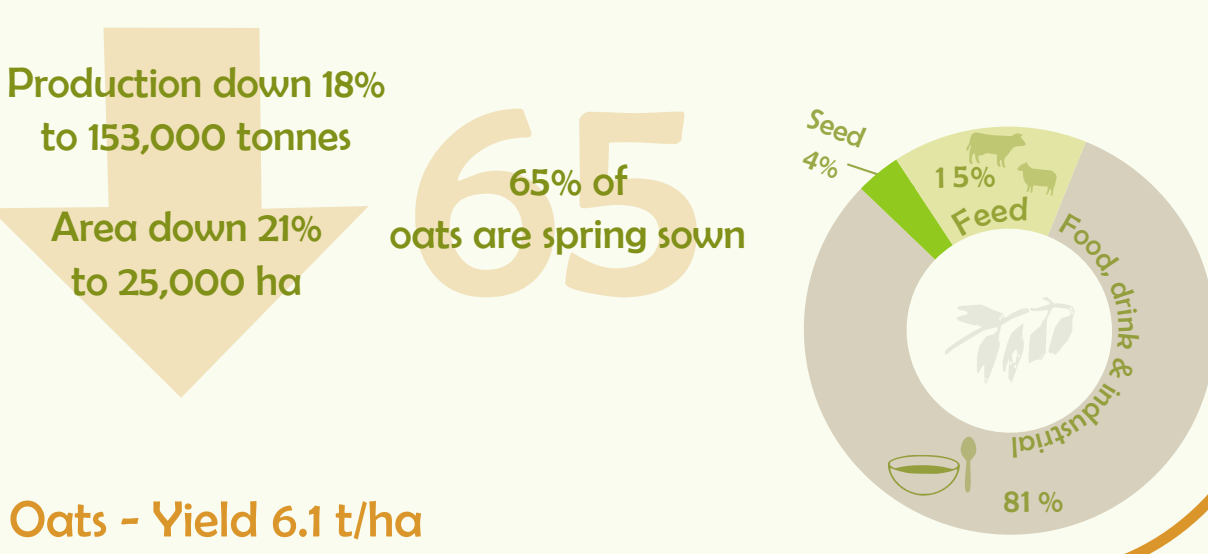
## Production Time series (tonnes)



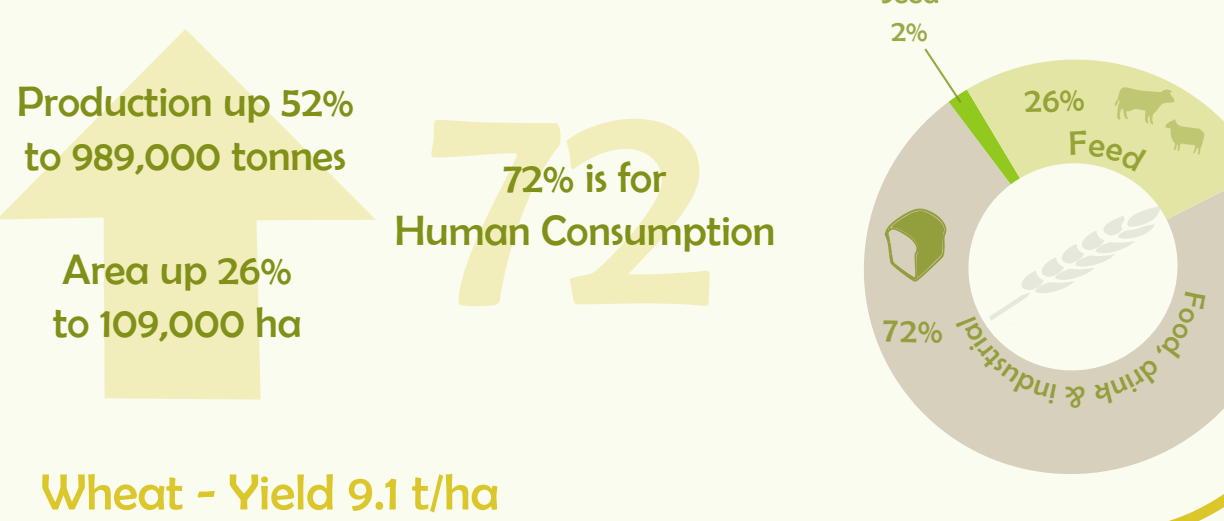
## Oilseed rape is mainly exported for biofuels



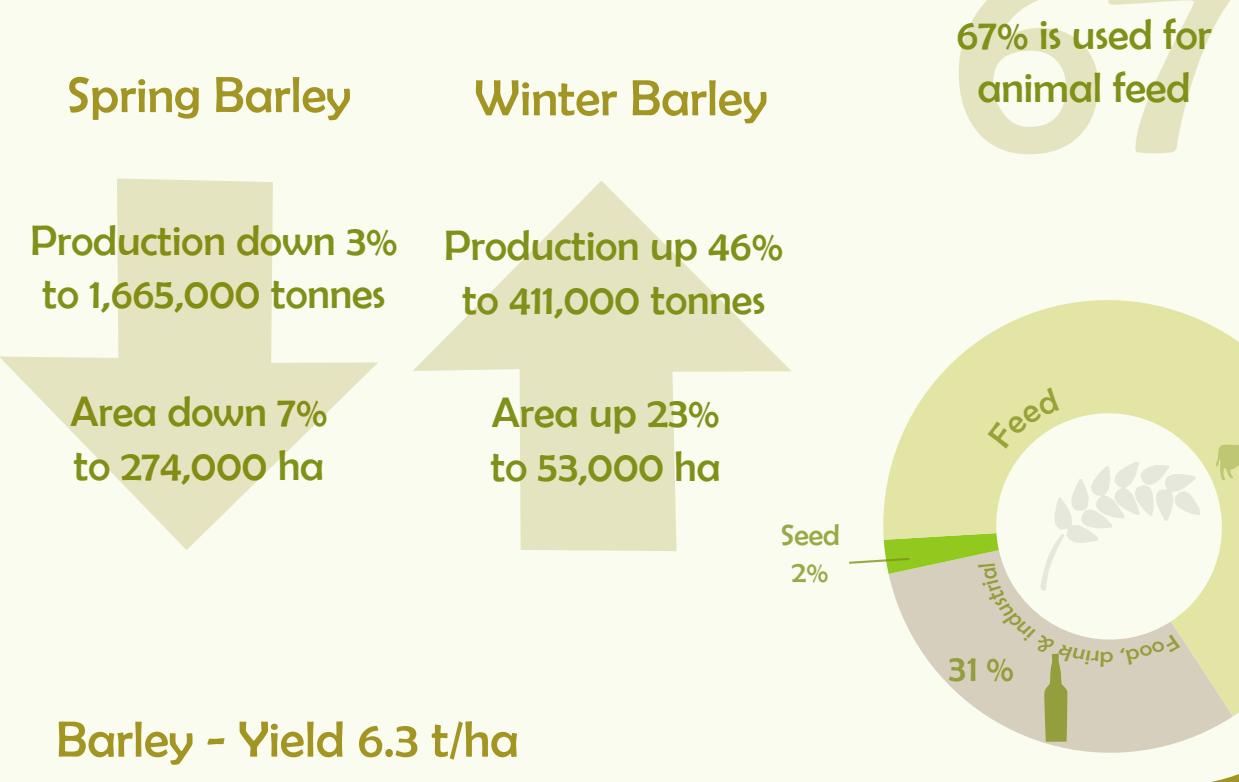
Majority of Oats are used for milling and processing for human consumption such as breakfast cereals
